

Recommendations

WORSHIP

Call, support, and maintain long-term Senior Chaplain

The Details:

- Long term pastoral leadership is key foundational pillar of a strong Church. (see Dr. Edgell Pyle's report on Role of Senior Chaplain, September 2004)

Rationale:

- Sunday morning at Snowmass Chapel is our most important ministry opportunity.

Keys to Success:

- Strong preaching/pastoral leadership.
- Creative music programs.
- Pulpit Chair Endowment.

EDUCATION

Create the Christian Life Center and formalizing the Senior Pastor Fellowship Program

The Details:

- In 2007, following the completion of the New Sanctuary, SC should be positioned to begin these programs.

Rationale:

- SC is located in the ideal community to create a National preaching/teaching program. (see Dr. Edgell Pyle's report on Senior Pastor December 2004)
- These programs, in step with the local ministry, will define SC for the next 25-50 years.

Keys to Success:

- Connection to second-homeowner's congregations.
- Endowment funding.
- Leadership team to implement and oversee both programs.
- Competition of New Sanctuary.

Recommendations

BENEVOLENCE

Appoint Benevolence Council to oversee all missions and outreach programs.

The Details:

- Appoint one team to oversee all benevolence and mission projects that touch hearts and lift up souls.

Rationale:

- Mission is one of the foundational pillars of a strong church, without it churches grow independent and inward.

Keys to Success:

- Committed lay leadership.
- Clear programs and projects.
- Hands-on experiences.

STEWARDSHIP

**Establish a Stewardship Council.
Create a financial model to fund the programs outlined above.**

The Details:

- Create a unified stewardship program, independent of Edgell, with a Biblical understanding. (See Dr. Rodin's and Dr. Edgell Pyle's reports)

Rationale:

- The Boards must accept total responsibility for the stewardship of SC.

Keys to Success:

- Strong Board, Trustees and NAB members, commitment and leadership.
- Clear ministry program goals.
- Create the right messages for the right audiences.
